HOPE IN RESURRECTION

I like to joke that my grandma was an old-school Catholic. But, to be honest, I'm not sure what that even means. Yes, there was a picture of Jesus or Mary (more likely, though, both) in every room of her house ... including the bathroom. We were not allowed to rest our bums on the pew as we knelt during Mass. She unrolled the waist of my uniform skirt when I tried to test the definition of "finger-tip length."

And, we certainly didn't dare to eat between meals on Ash Wednesday. Or, you didn't tell her that you stopped through the Dunkin Donuts drivethrough on your way home from Key Club.

There wasn't a Good Friday that she didn't become a meteorologist. "It always storms between noon and 3 p.m.," she declared as we sat quiet.

Those who knew my grandma, though, knew her as a woman of strong faith, devotion, and steadfast love. She was a woman who said the rosary every day, often went to Mass several times a week, and had unwavering trust in God.

And so I couldn't help but draw the parallel that the one-year anniversary of her death fell on Good Friday in 2019.

For months, the weight of losing my grandmother had been with me. I felt heavy yet hollow as I tried to navigate this new life without her. It seemed so hard to move forward much less continue to put one foot in front of the other for a run.

But on that day, April 19, 2019, I laced up my running shoes and walked out my front door. Without a plan, without expectation. My only hope was to find the space and peace I would need to get through that day.

I headed out on a familiar route through Foster Park. But as I took a slight detour, I felt like I couldn't do it any more. I was running too fast. My heart felt like it was going to explode.

But as I shifted my attention from how I felt, I was struck by my surroundings. There was bark peeling from a sycamore tree as fresh grass sprouted from the earth. The birds were chirping and squirrels were playing.

After such a horrible winter, there was promise of new life.

It was like that day, Good Friday.

After Jesus' suffering and death on the cross, there is hope and promise of Resurrection. His sacrifice means that we can live.

At my grandma's funeral, I quoted the lyrics of a contemporary Christian song —"Whole Heart."

Your love
It comes with no conditions
You give us Your whole heart
My hope
Is in the blood of Jesus
I know who I am
Because of who You are

We are who we are because
Jesus sacrificed himself on the
cross. Through his crucifixion and
resurrection, we are able to be called
from out of sin. Out of darkness.

Even in the hardest moments, we are shown unconditional love and mercy. We are able to have hope. We are able to see the green leaves, and the light through the trees.

Christ has risen. He has risen indeed!
