Misison opportunity: Henderson trip

You are invited to participate in the FWSUMC mission trip to Henderson Settlement this summer!

The trip will be Sunday, June 9 through Saturday, June 15.

The trip is open to congregation members ages 12 and older.

Henderson Settlement is a United Methodist mission in Frakes, Ky., and it serves the people of Appalachia.

A work camp trip provides the opportunity to understand both the diversity and commonality of all people while gaining a fresh perspective on your own life.

While work projects have not yet been selected for our trip, volunteers can expect to do home repair-type work.

Team members will stay in dorm-style housing, and the Henderson staff provide all meals (except on the free day).

Work hours are typically 8 am



to 4:30 pm. Volunteers will work Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Wednesday is a free day, providing team members the opportunity a chance to rest or enjoy the surrounding area.

The cost of the trip will be \$375, which will cover the cost of meals, housing, and our free day activity. Fundraising efforts may offset these costs.

A portion of youth fees will be covered by the youth mission

fund.

A deposit of \$50 is due by Feb. 1. The remainder of the balance will be due May 1.
