
Exploring faith through music

Former member honored

Marty Wyall, a member of this congregation who died in 2017, will be inducted into the Indiana Aviation Hall of Fame on September 27, 2025. Her daughter, Martha Pohl, shared that there will be a permanent plaque with the names of the inductees at the Indianapolis International Airport.

Marty was a member of the WASPs (Women Airforce Service Pilots), civilian women who flew planes for the US Air Force during WWII to free men for combat duty. They tested aircraft, ferried planes from factories to bases or from base to base, trained other pilots, and towed targets for live anti-aircraft gun practice. Later, she became the official historian of the WASPs. These women were awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 2009.
