Ways to get involved

Hospitality: Be a greeter, serve coffee, or help with receptions and Wednesday night meals.

Music & Worship: Join the choir, praise team, handbells, or help run audio/visual.

Teaching & Spiritual Growth: Be a teacher or helper for children, youth, or adults.

Outreach: Tutor at Indian Village, help with the water bottle ministry, serve meals, or assist with events like the Rummage Sale.

Care & Connection: Join a prayer group, help with funeral

dinners, knit prayer shawls, or serve in Stephen Ministry.

Office & Facility Help: Answer phones, assist with mailings, or help keep the church grounds tidy.

Committees & Planning Teams: Share your ideas and leadership on various ministry teams.

A full list of volunteer opportunities is available at the Welcome Center desk. When you're ready, check off one or more areas of interest and drop your selection into the boxes located at the back of the sanctuary or Welcome Center. Someone already serving in that area will follow up with you.

We know life is busy. But we also know the value of stepping into something that matters — not just for the church, but for you. Serving is a way to meet new people, grow spiritually, and live out your faith in practical, meaningful ways.

Indian Village school supply drive

First Wayne Street UMC is once again collecting school supplies for our partner school, Indian Village Elementary, through the Associated Churches Rising Stars program.

Many students at Indian Village rely on school-provided supplies each year, and our ongoing support helps ensure they're ready to learn.

The principal shared how impactful these donations can be. "We had foster children come in with nothing, and we were able to give them donated backpacks and supplies. They were overjoyed, and the foster parent was very grateful." Another student was so proud of his new backpack that he didn't want to take it off.

About one-third of Indian Village students need supplies each year. Many come from single-income homes where budgets are tight. Your donations



help students participate more fully in class—and feel more confident doing so.

Beyond supplies, our church's partnership has become part of the school's support system. "The friendships formed with your volunteers give children a sense of hope and security," the principal said. "It helps both students and teachers feel supported."

Needed Supplies

Colored pencils, crayons, composition notebooks, pink erasers, dry erase markers, Play-Doh, sidewalk chalk, sticky notes, tissues, socks, underwear (child sizes), folders with prongs, glue sticks, hand sanitizer, storage bags, pencil bags or boxes, disinfectant wipes, book bags, and reusable water bottles.

Donations can be placed in the SHOCKING PINK box near the sanctuary.
