
Each week will focus on a different aspect of holistic generosity:

Out - Romans 12:1–2



October 5: One Table, One Mission: Joyfully United - 2 Corinthians 9:10-15

Throughout the series, we will be asking important questions:

- How is God calling me to give of myself?
- What gifts and abilities do I have that could bless others?
- Where might I make space in my schedule to serve?
- How might I invest my resources in ways that honor

God and build the kingdom?

As we prayerfully reflect on these questions, we will also be preparing our hearts for a special moment of commitment on Sunday, October 5, which is also World Communion Sunday. On that day, we will join Christians across the globe in sharing the Lord's Supper and will consecrate our gifts and commitments for the coming year — our pledges of time, talents, and treasures — as an act of worship and unity.

This is more than a series about giving. It's an invitation to step into a richer, more joyful, and more connected way of living. Holistic generosity reflects God's heart — and when we live this way, the world catches a glimpse of the Kingdom of God.

We encourage you to be present each week, to open your heart to the Spirit's leading, and to prayerfully consider how you might live generously in the year ahead.
